AN AREA RICH IN HERITAGE & CONSERVATION POTENTIAL

The Urisino Ecosystem Project is sequestering carbon in Mulga trees over the large area of the historic Urisino cattle station area in the West of NSW.

This is achieved by humanely stopping the overgrazing of the land by the native wild goat population.

By relocating the goats to the south the land is allowed to regenerate the native flora and fauna.

In the process Urisino has become the largest land regeneration project in Australia. The first of its kind and larger than the country of Singapore!

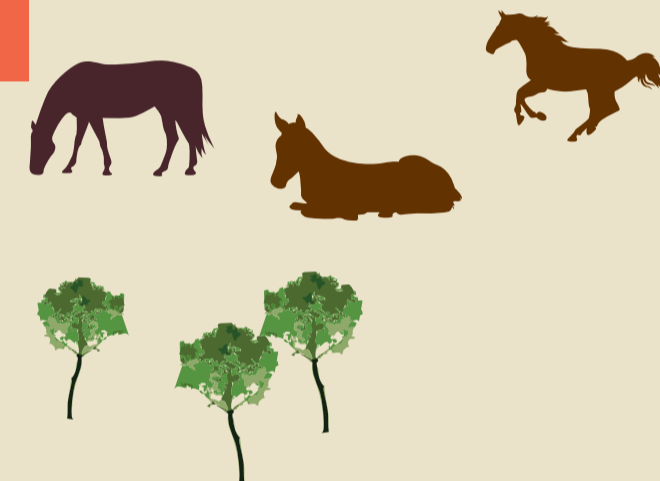


PAROO RIVER
